CORINTH: SERVE TOGETHER

1 Corinthians 3:5-9

Memory Verse: "We are God's coworkers, working together in God's field."

- 1 Corinthians 3:9 (adapted)

Corinth was a thriving city, famous for its wealth, diversity, and competitive spirit. The early church there struggled with pride, favoritism, and division. Some people said they followed Paul, others Apollos, and the church started to split into factions. In his letter, Paul reminded them that no person – not even the leaders – was the focus of their faith. Instead, they were all servants working together in God's field. Paul used the image of planting and watering to teach that while each person plays a part, only God makes things grow.

☐ Friday: Read Romans 12:4-8.
What are some gifts God has given you (kindness, listening, helping)?
How might you use one of those gifts to serve with someone else this week?
☐ Saturday: Read Ecclesiastes 4:9.

What matters most is not who gets credit, but whether we are faithful with the work God has given us. We're all on the same team, building something bigger than ourselves.
