# **INVEST IN THE FUTURE**

### Psalm 78:1-7

Moses would never enter the promised land, but prepared Joshua to lead the next generation. David would not see the Temple built in his lifetime, but prepared everything for his son Solomon. We may not always see the results of our investments, but we can prepare the way.

### ■ Monday: Read Psalm 78:1-4.

"We will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord..." What stories of God's faithfulness have shaped your faith?

Who told you these stories, and how did their witness strengthen you?

# ☐ Tuesday: Read Psalm 78:5-6.

"...so the next generation would know them, even the children yet to be born, and they in turn would tell their children."

What habits of faith do you hope to pass on to the next generation? How can you help?

## ☐ Wednesday: Read 1 Chronicles 22:5-10.

"My son Solomon is young and inexperienced... so I will make preparations for it." What spiritual or practical "materials" has God placed in your hands right now that could help someone else build well later?

# ☐ Thursday: Read 1 Chronicles 22:11-13.

"Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or discouraged."

Whose future faith or ministry might God be calling you to strengthen?

How can you encourage someone else to use their gifts and passions to serve God?

#### ☐ Friday: Read Mark 4:1-9.

"A sower went forth to sow."

Where might God be inviting you to invest generously - even when you're unsure of the soil? What seed can you plant now that might bless the next generation?

### ☐ Saturday: Read Psalm 78:1-7.

"Then they would put their trust in God and would not forget His deeds but would keep His commands."

What investment can you make right now – in relationships, ministry, or generosity – that will bless others in the future?

Investing in the future means laying foundations for others to build upon.

Sometimes, investing means planting seeds we'll never see grow.

What legacy are we leaving—for the next generation, and for God's kingdom?

Practice: Make an investment in the church for future generations.
