From the very beginning, God declared God's work "very good," affirming the inherent worth and purpose of every piece of creation. In other stories of creation around the time of the writing of Genesis, the creation of humanity was unintentional, an accident in some of the stories. Genesis tells a different story about the one God and Creator. We are not random or insignificant. Instead, we are intentionally created in God's image, entrusted with the care of creation and the earth. We are designed in goodness and grace.
